- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, with the agreement of the Council of the London Borough of Wandsworth proposes to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The general effect of the Order would be to provide that the existing ban on vehicles weighing more than 3 tonnes maximum gross weight from proceeding over Albert Bridge and in the approach road on its north side between Albert Bridge and Chelsea Embankment applies only to goods vehicles and not to all vehicles.
