Introduction

Background

Over the last few months, the Council has sought the views of the local community about potential improvements to Avondale Park. This was collected through an initial ideas and feedback period, followed by focus groups sessions with internal and external stakeholders. The results from these two previous phases were used to shape the public consultation survey. This report analyses the findings from this survey to understand the local community's views about the proposed changes at Avondale Park.

Methodology and report

The survey was developed with colleagues from the Parks Projects Team. The survey was promoted via the Council's communication channels, such as e-newsletters and social media, as well as letter drops to the local area. The survey closed on 13 September 2021 and 154 online submissions were received. Where graphs are shown, percentages are used. Where questions received a low number of comments, theming was not suitable, however all comments can be found in the appendix document.

Results at a glance – Public survey findings

- **Support for outdoor gym:** The majority (77 per cent) of respondents **supported** the installation of a new outdoor gym at Avondale Park. A total of 15 per cent of respondents **did not support** the installation of a new outdoor gym.
- **Types of equipment to be included in the outdoor gym:** A total of 37 per cent of respondents preferred a **combination of calisthenics (body weight) and other fitness equipment**. A total of 29 per cent preferred **calisthenics equipment only**, whilst 16 per cent preferred a **variety of fitness equipment**.
- **Support for installation of fencing around the outdoor gym:** A total of 46 per cent of respondents **supported** the idea of installing fencing around the outdoor gym. Whilst 28 per cent of respondents **did not support** the installation of fencing around the outdoor gym. A total of 14 per cent of respondent selected **don't know**.
- **Satisfaction with current junior playground:** A net total of 32 per cent (eight per cent very satisfied, 24 per cent satisfied) of respondents were **satisfied** with the current junior playground. A net total of 16 per cent (10 per cent dissatisfied, six per cent very dissatisfied) of respondents were **dissatisfied** with the current junior playground.
- **Preferred theme for junior playground proposals:** A total of 49 per cent of respondents selected **nature/wildlife** theme to be included as part of the junior playground. Whilst 23 per cent of respondent selected both the **jungle** theme and the **space** theme, and 18 per cent selected **underwater/pirate** theme for the junior playground.
- **Type of material used for the junior playground proposals:** A total of 56 per cent of respondents outlined they wanted **wood/timber/natural** to be used for the junior playground equipment. A total of 12 per cent of respondents selected **metallic** as the material to be used for the junior playground equipment.
- **Types of equipment included in junior playground proposals:** A total of 45 per cent of respondents selected **multi-unit/climbing frames**, and 44 per cent of all respondents selected **balancing equipment, jumper/trampoline and swings**. The least popular options were **rocking/springer equipment** (27 per cent) and **sculpture features** (20 per cent).



Results at a glance – Public survey findings

- **Satisfaction with children's larger play area:** A net total of 33 per cent (eight per cent very satisfied, 25 per cent satisfied) of respondents were **satisfied** with the larger play area. A net total of 23 per cent (18 per cent dissatisfied, five per cent very dissatisfied) of respondents were **dissatisfied** with the current larger play area.
- **Supporting fencing around the children's larger play area:** A total of 34 per cent of respondents **supported** the idea of installing fencing around the larger play area. Whilst 36 per cent of respondents **did not support** the installation of fencing around the larger play area.
- **Views on surfacing the children's larger play area:** Nearly half (47 per cent) of respondents preferred to **keep the current layout of the larger play area**. Nearly a quarter (24 per cent) of respondents supported **surfacing the whole of the larger play area**.
- **Type of equipment in the children's larger play area:** Half (50 per cent) of respondents selected **swings**, 48 per cent selected **multi-unit/climbing frames** and 46 per cent selected **zip-line**. The least popular option was **dynamic/spinning equipment** (38 per cent), although this is still a high proportion of the survey respondents.
- **Views on seating areas in the park:** A total of 38 per cent of respondents thought that the existing seating areas in the park **were** adequate. Whilst 39 per cent of respondents felt that the existing seating areas in the park **were not** adequate.
- **Alternative seating in the park:** A total of 36 per cent of respondents would like to see **both improvements to the existing seating and the introduction of a new seating area/s**. A total of 18 per cent of respondents would like to see **improvements to the existing seating areas only**. A total of 17 per cent of respondents would like to see the introduction of **additional covered seating area/s**.
- **Setting up a community garden area:** A total of 43 per cent of respondents were **in favour** of setting up a community garden area which residents would help maintain. Whilst a fifth (20 per cent) of respondents were **not in favour** of setting up a community garden area.

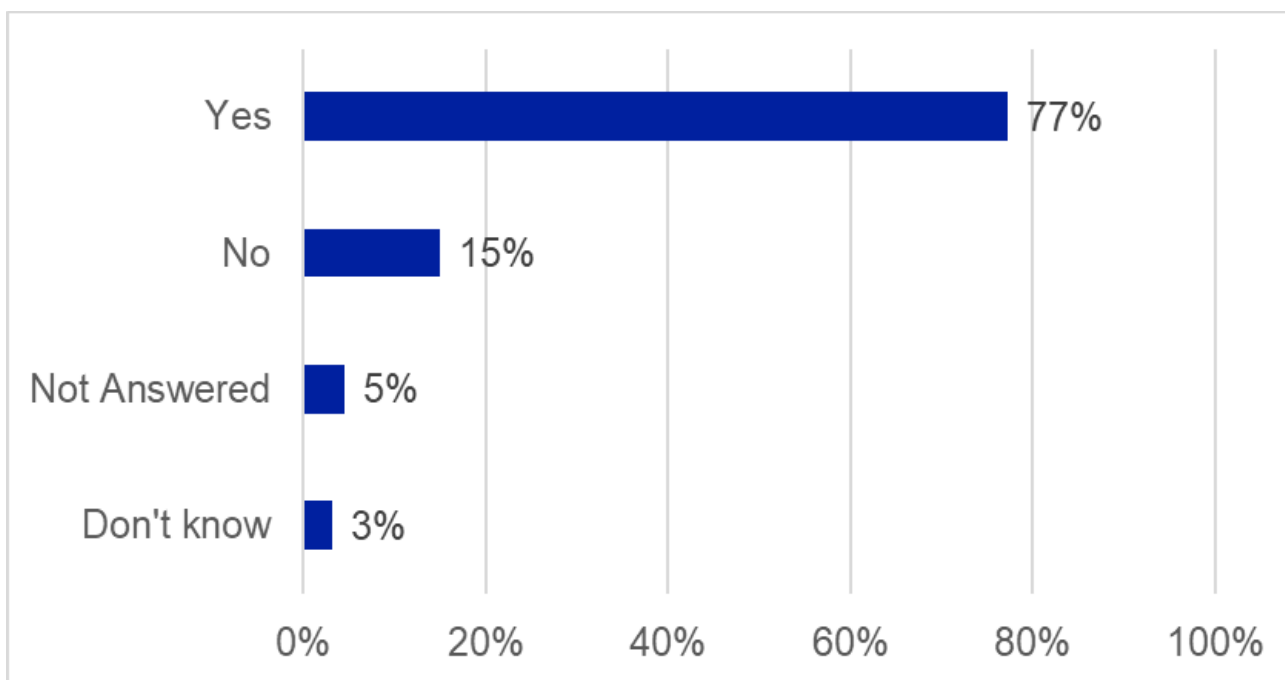

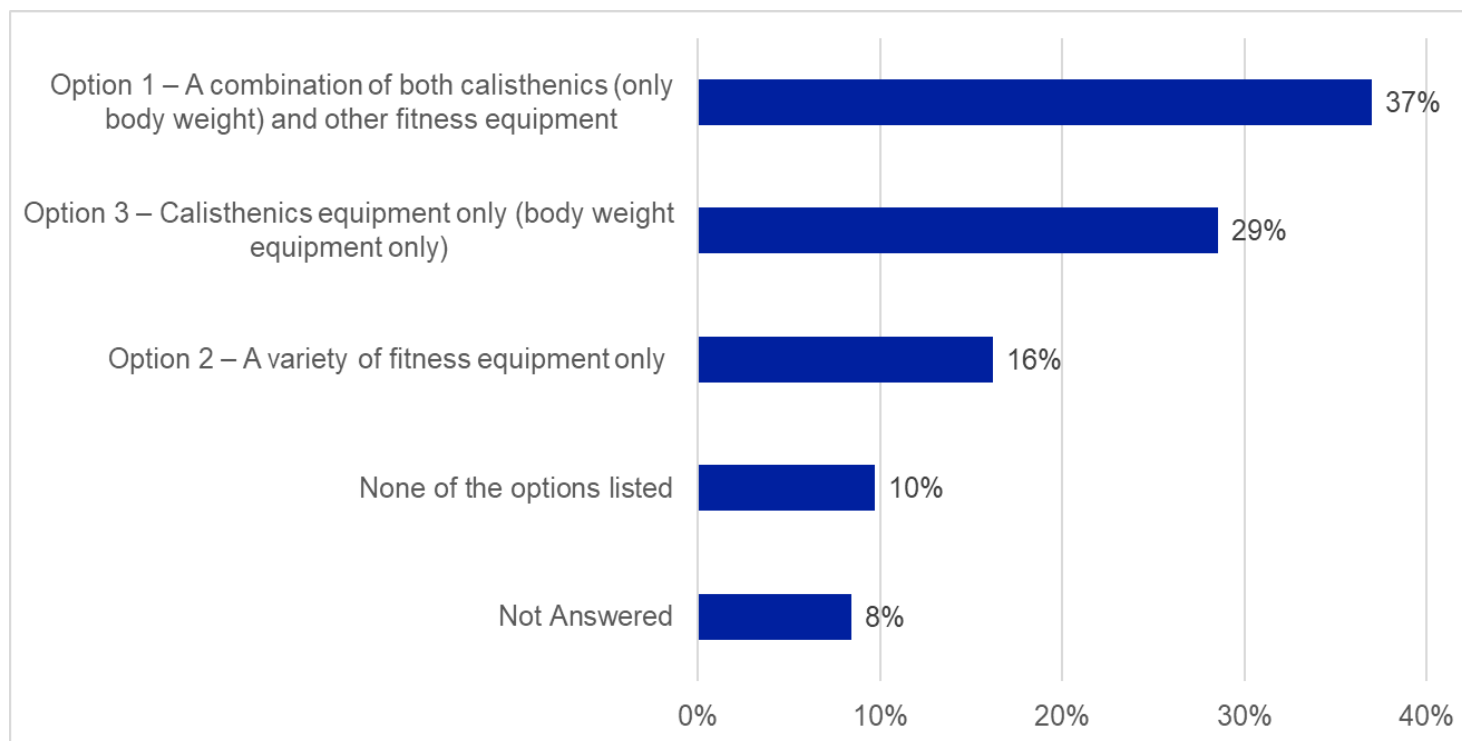

- A total of 37 per cent of respondents preferred a **combination of calisthenics (body weight) and other fitness equipment**.
- A total of 29 per cent preferred **calisthenics equipment only**, whilst 16 per cent preferred a **variety of fitness equipment**. A total of 10 per cent of respondents selected **none of the options listed**.

Specific gym equipment - Comments

“Pullup bars, dip bars, Swedish bars, gymnastics rings.”

Calisthenics/bars for bodyweight exercises

“Stationary Bike needed.”

Bike

“At the very minimum two sets of varying height pullup bars as well as three sets of parallel bars as shown in Option 3. I have been training at calisthenics parks for years and can guarantee that one set of each will not be enough. The downside of having too little equipment is that you tend to get regulars who sit on the equipment or 'hog' it and then not everyone can workout.

Ensure there is enough of equipment



“Parallel bars (x 2 sets at least) and varying height pullup bars (at least 10 as these will get very busy).”

“Rowing machine also great if there was a soft running circuit.”

“I really think that outdoor gyms become dated so quickly, that there should not be one installed at Avondale. They look like a relic from the 1980's (see Holland Park) and there really isn't the space at Avondale for one.”

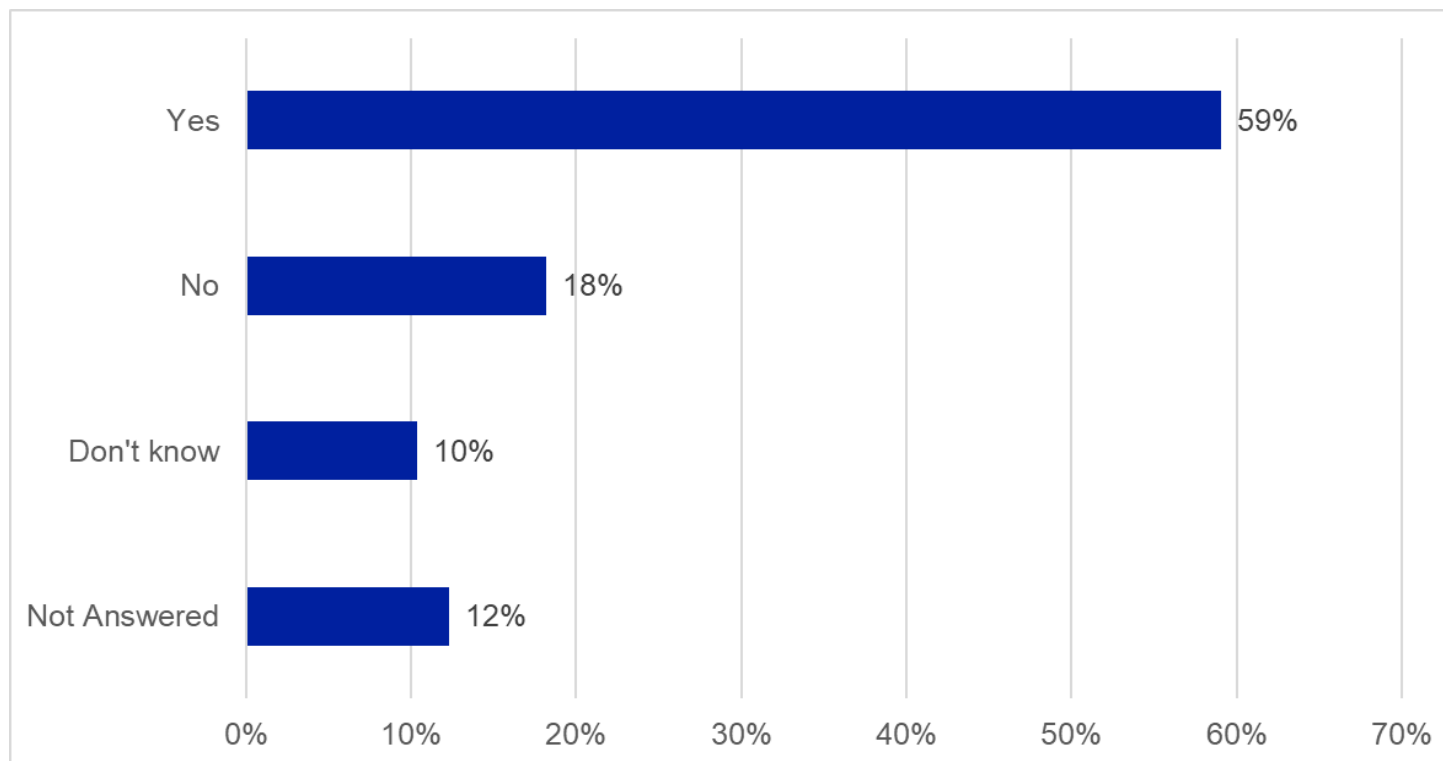

Supporting installation of suitable safety surfacing

Respondents were asked if they supported the idea of installing suitable safety surfacing, such as rubber mulch, or something similar, as part of the outdoor gym:

- A total of 59 per cent of respondents **supported** the idea of installing suitable safety surfacing, such as rubber mulch, as part of the outdoor gym.
- Whilst 18 per cent of respondents **did not support** the installation of suitable safety surfacing, such as rubber mulch, as part of the outdoor gym.

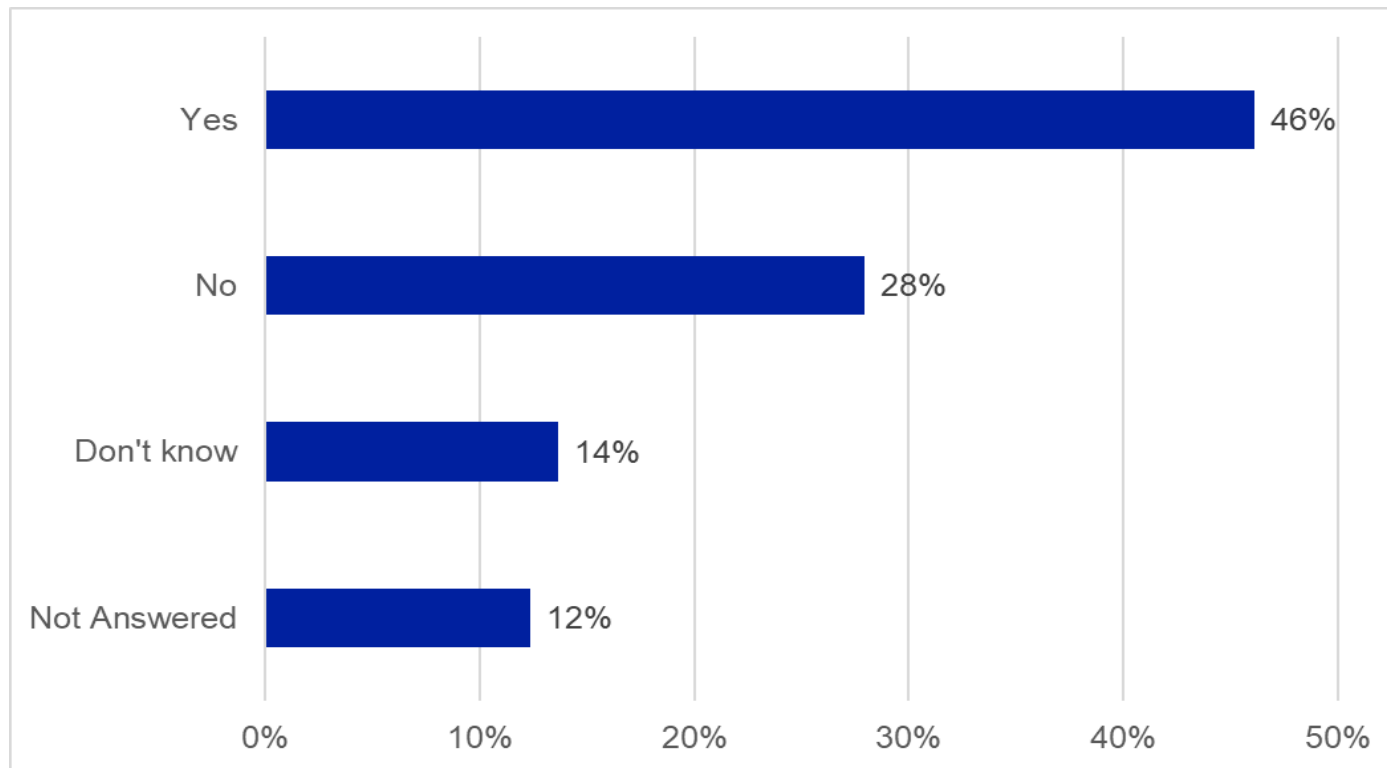

- A total of 14 per cent of respondents selected **don't know**.

Other comments about the outdoor gym

"I do NOT want the Park ruined with a gym of any kind. There is an excellent gym at Little Wormwood Scrubs and I do feel Avondale Park should be kept as a walking park for those of us who are NOT young and active, and love to walk around it and sit on its benches, and sometimes walk the dog there."

Do not include an outdoor gym at Avondale Park

"This would [be] such a great project - improving the lives and health of the local community. Thank you RBKC."

In favour of the project

"It would be good if this had some kind of low boundary to prevent toddlers, children and dogs wandering over it. Also, that would keep it clean and dog poo free. It should also be an adult-only area seeing as the rest of the park is dedicated to kids and they have a huge play area."

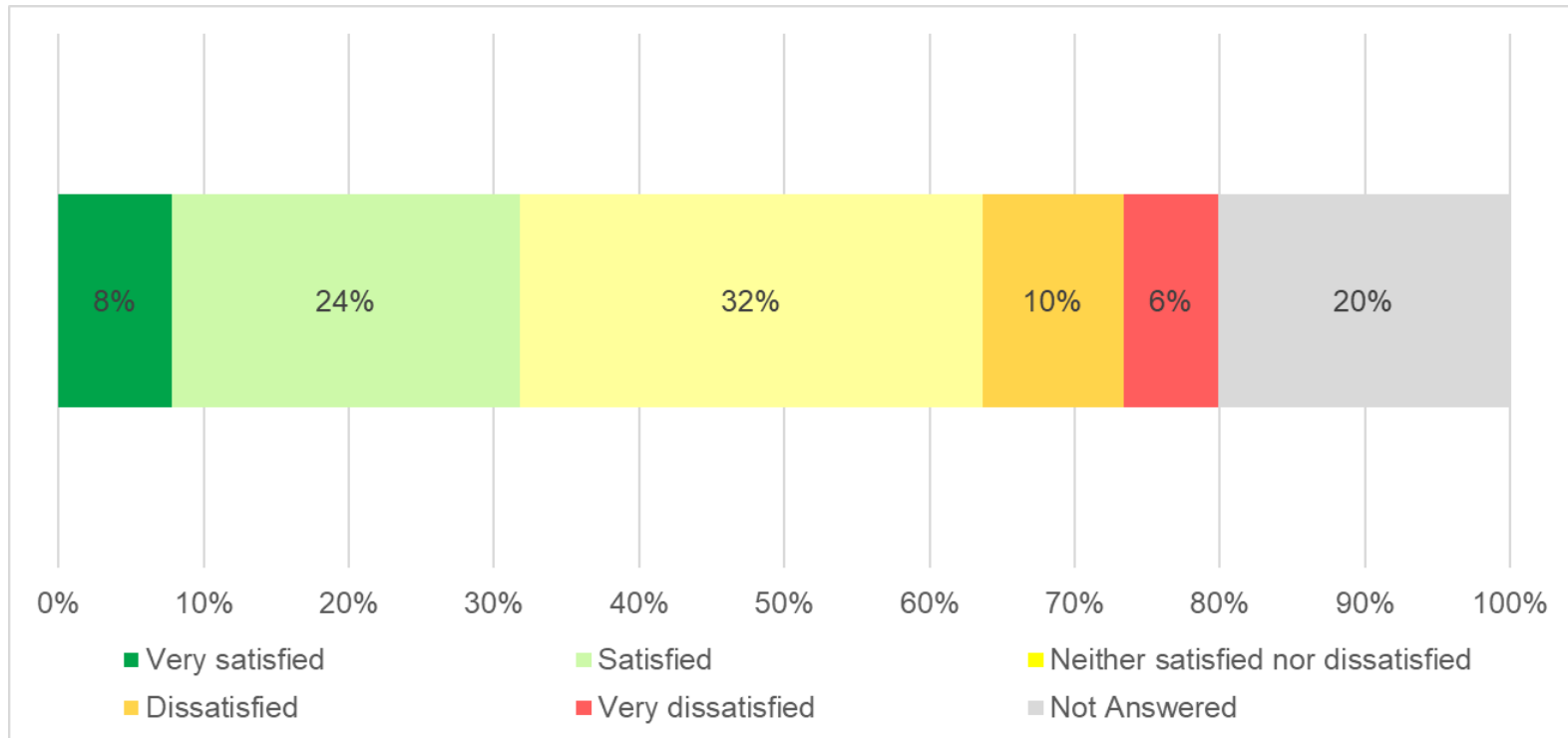

Respondents were asked how satisfied, or dissatisfied, they were with the current junior playground in Avondale Park:

- A net total of 32 per cent (eight per cent very satisfied, 24 per cent satisfied) of respondents were **satisfied** with the current junior playground.
- A net total of 16 per cent (10 per cent dissatisfied, six per cent very dissatisfied) of respondents were **dissatisfied** with the current junior playground.
- Around a third (32 per cent) of respondents were **neither satisfied nor dissatisfied** with the current junior playground.

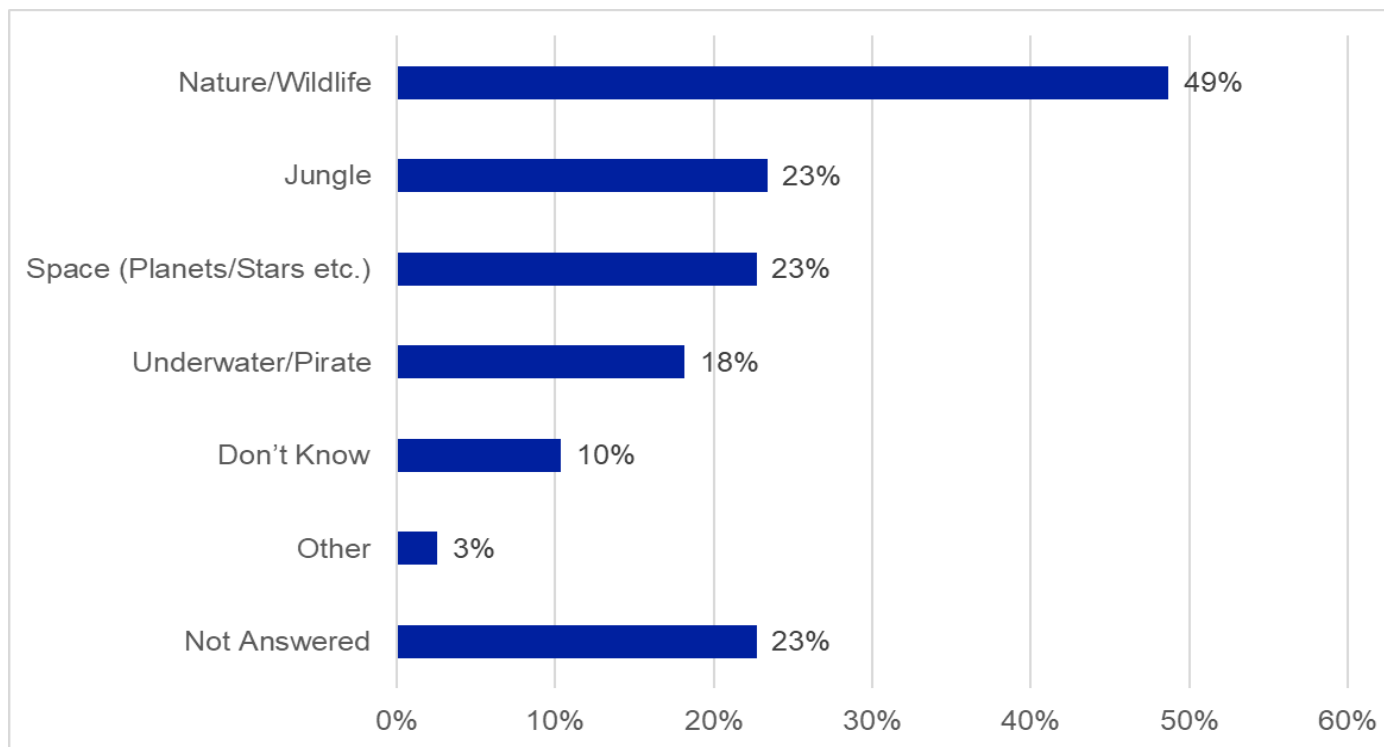

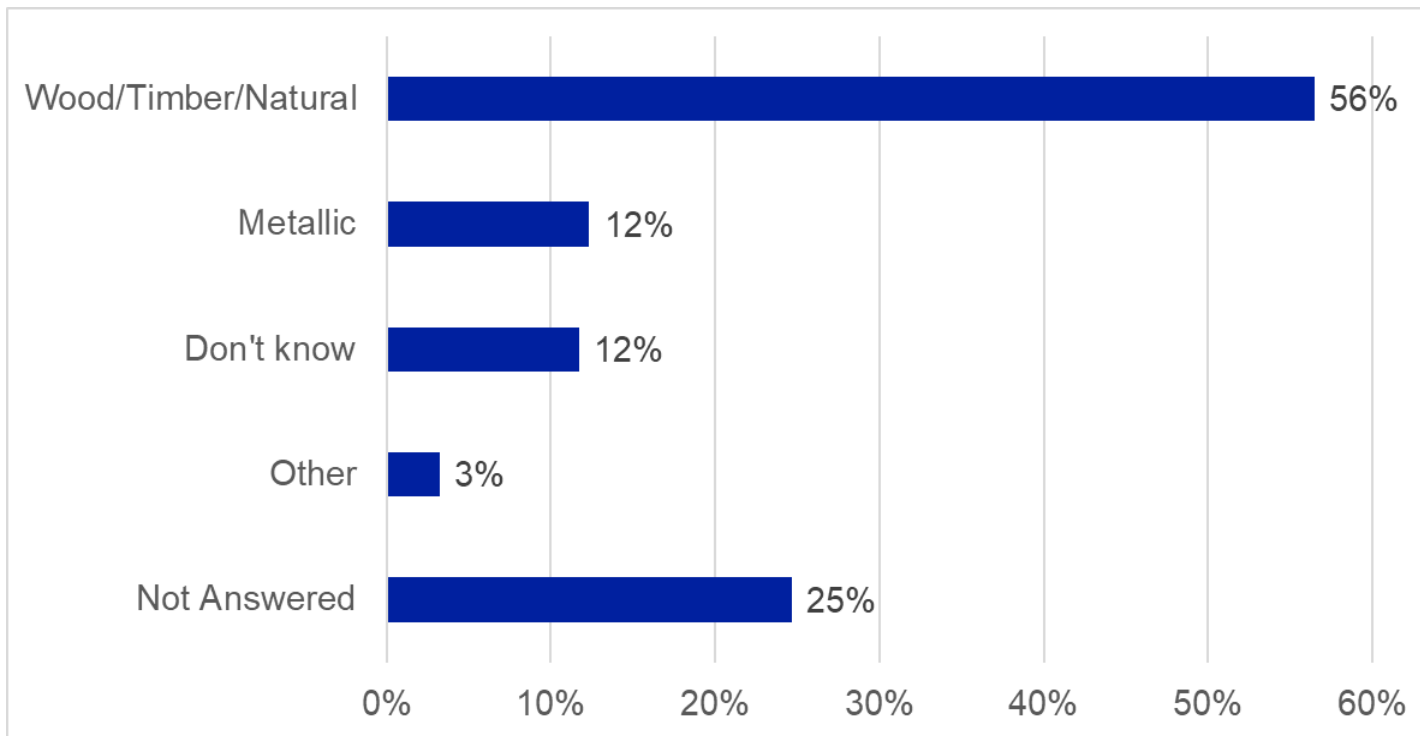

- A total of 12 per cent of respondents selected **don't know**; there were 13 comments made as part of the **other** response, and these can be seen in the appendix document.

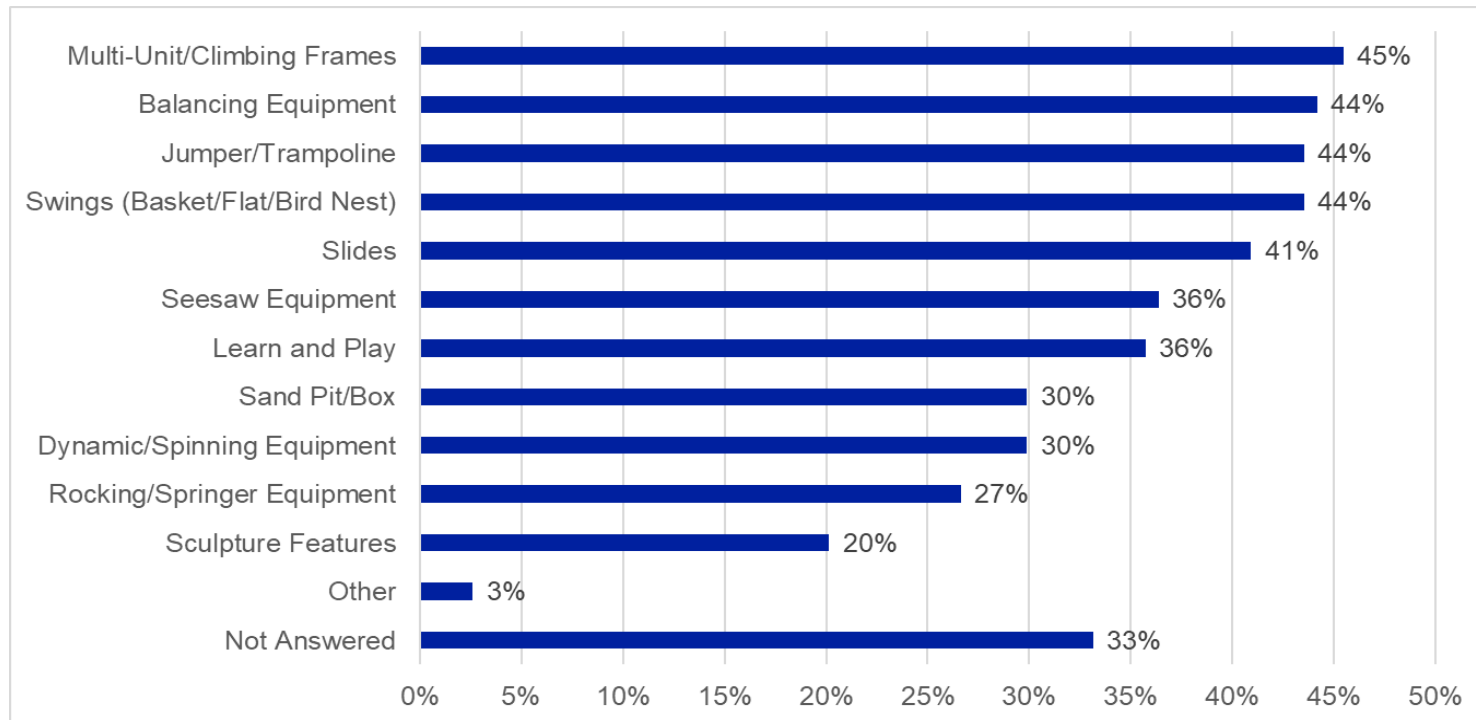

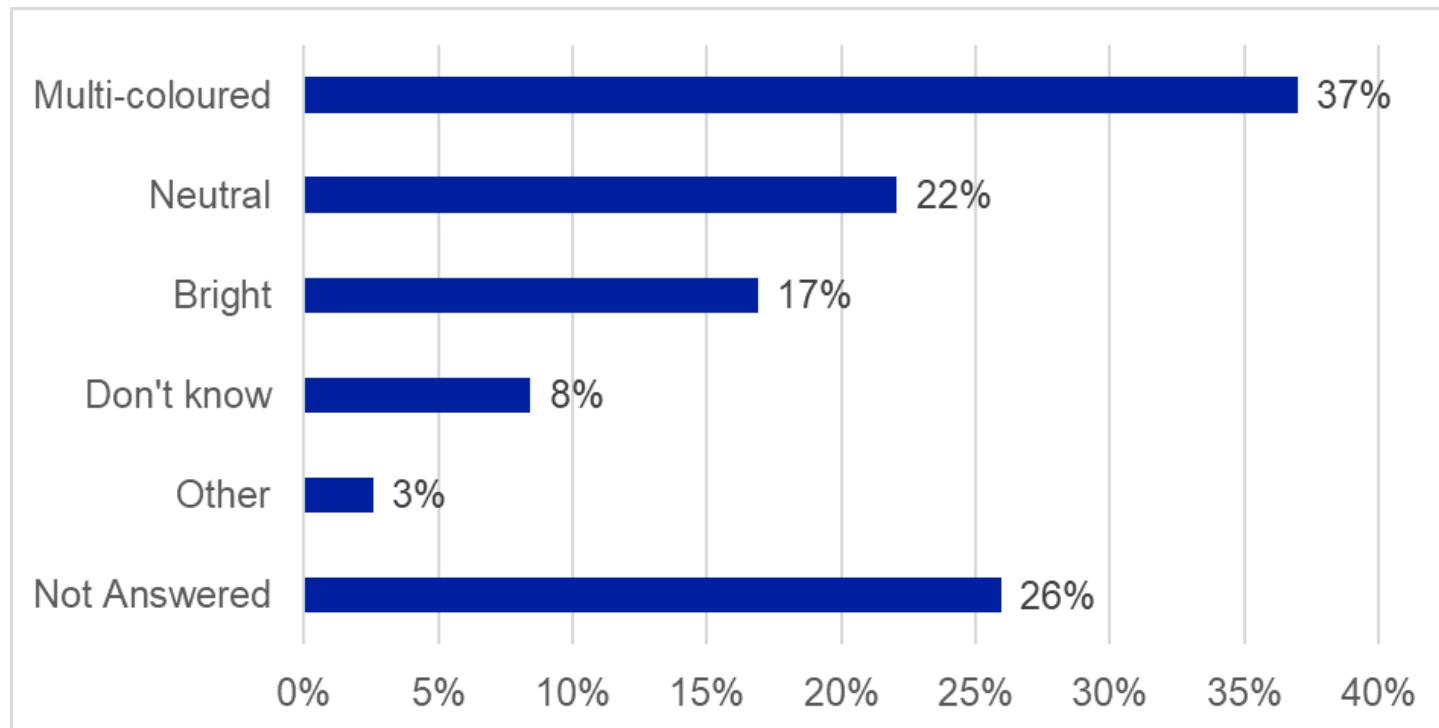

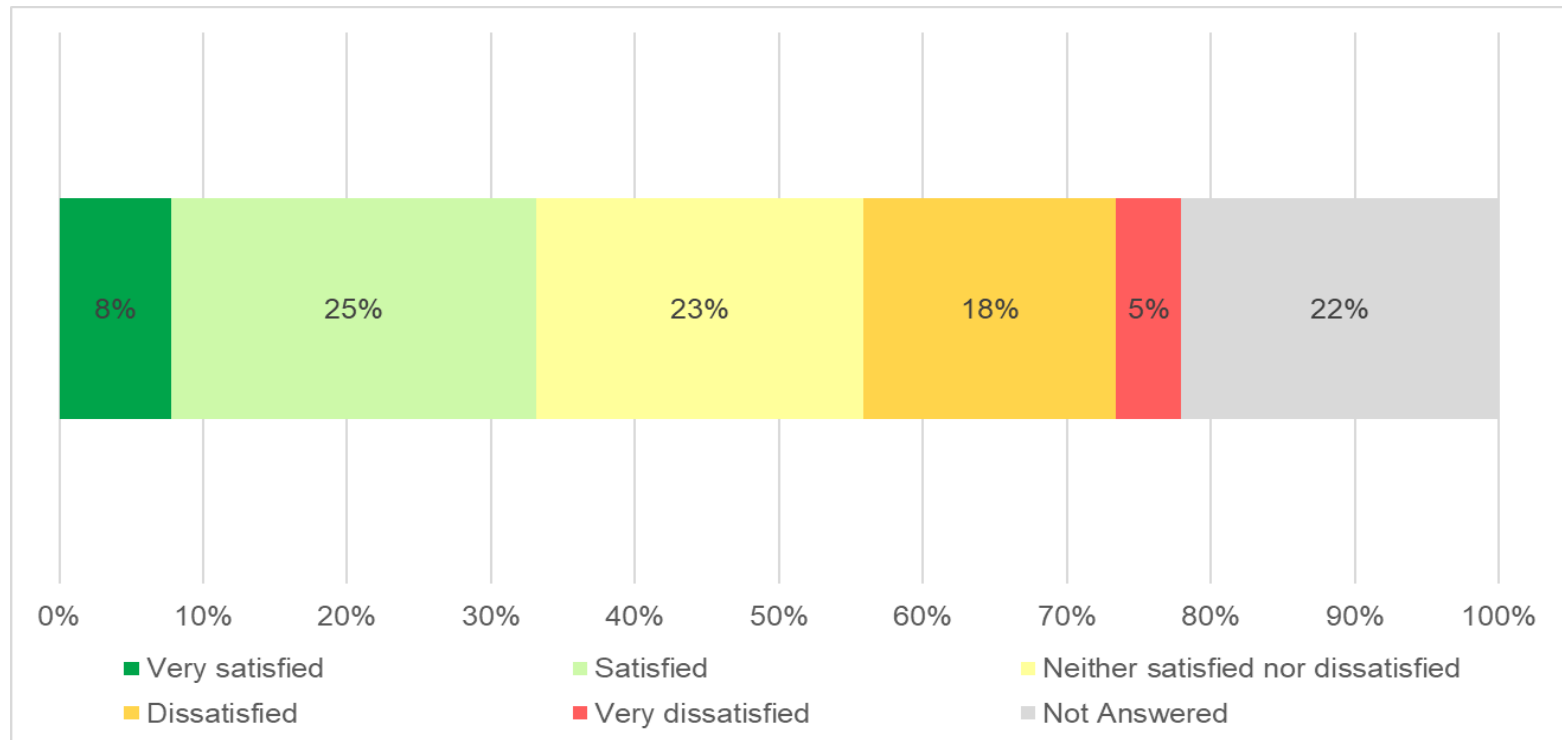

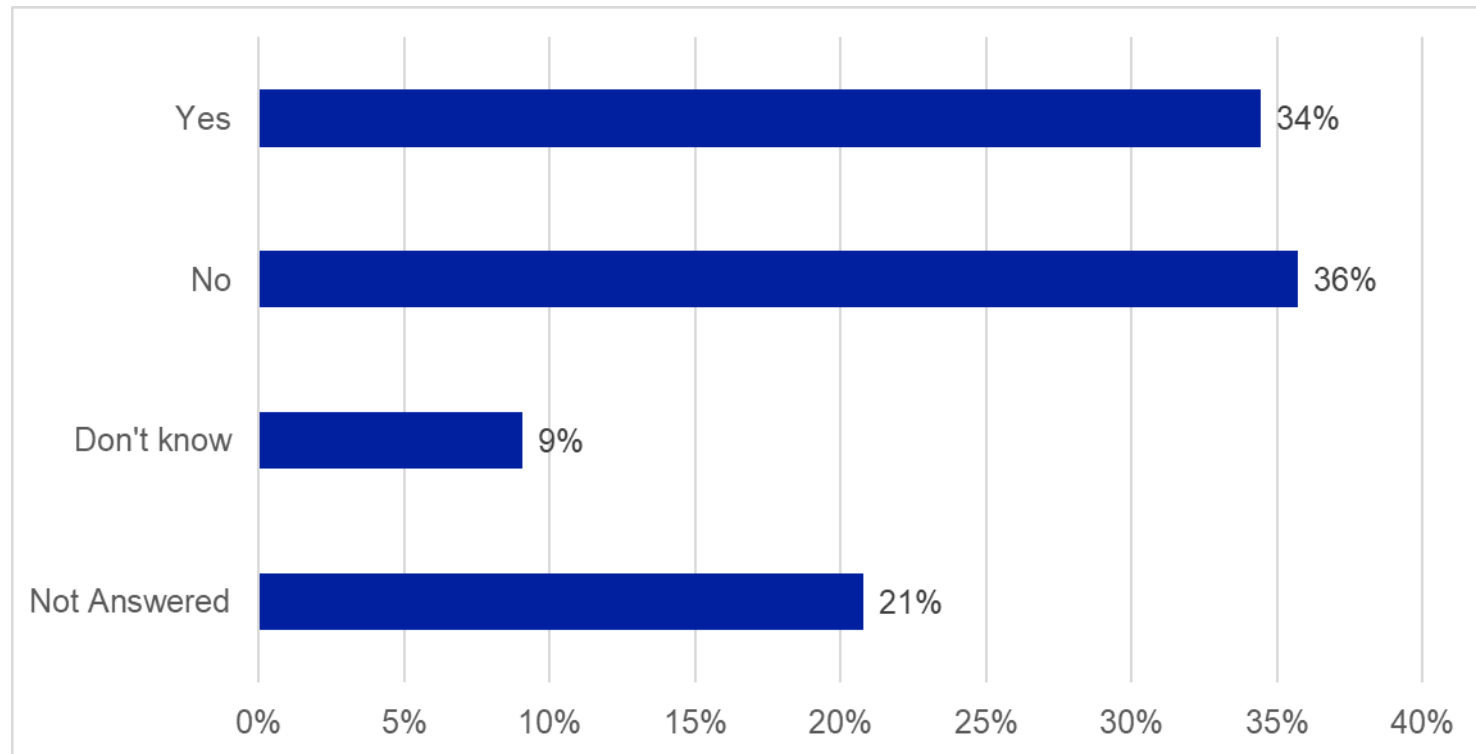

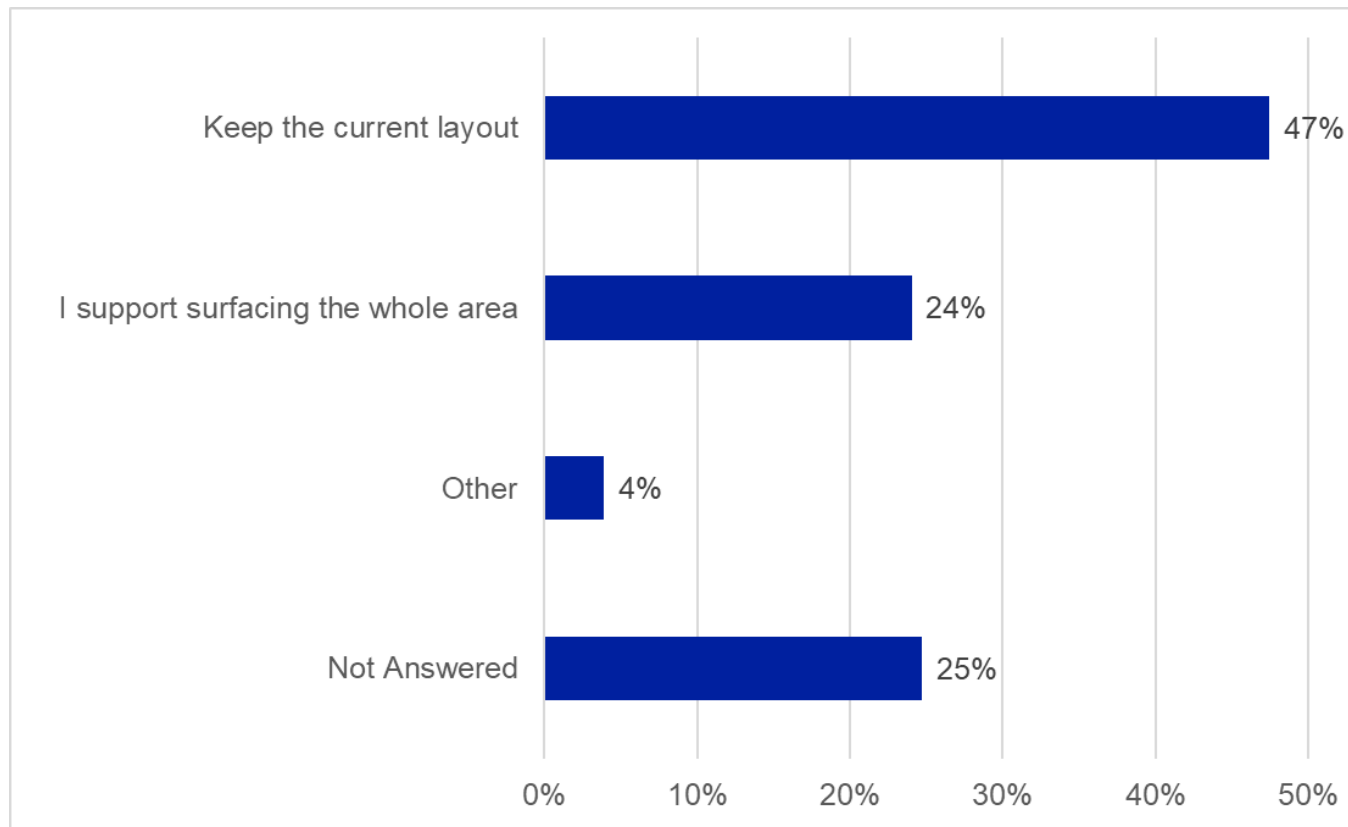

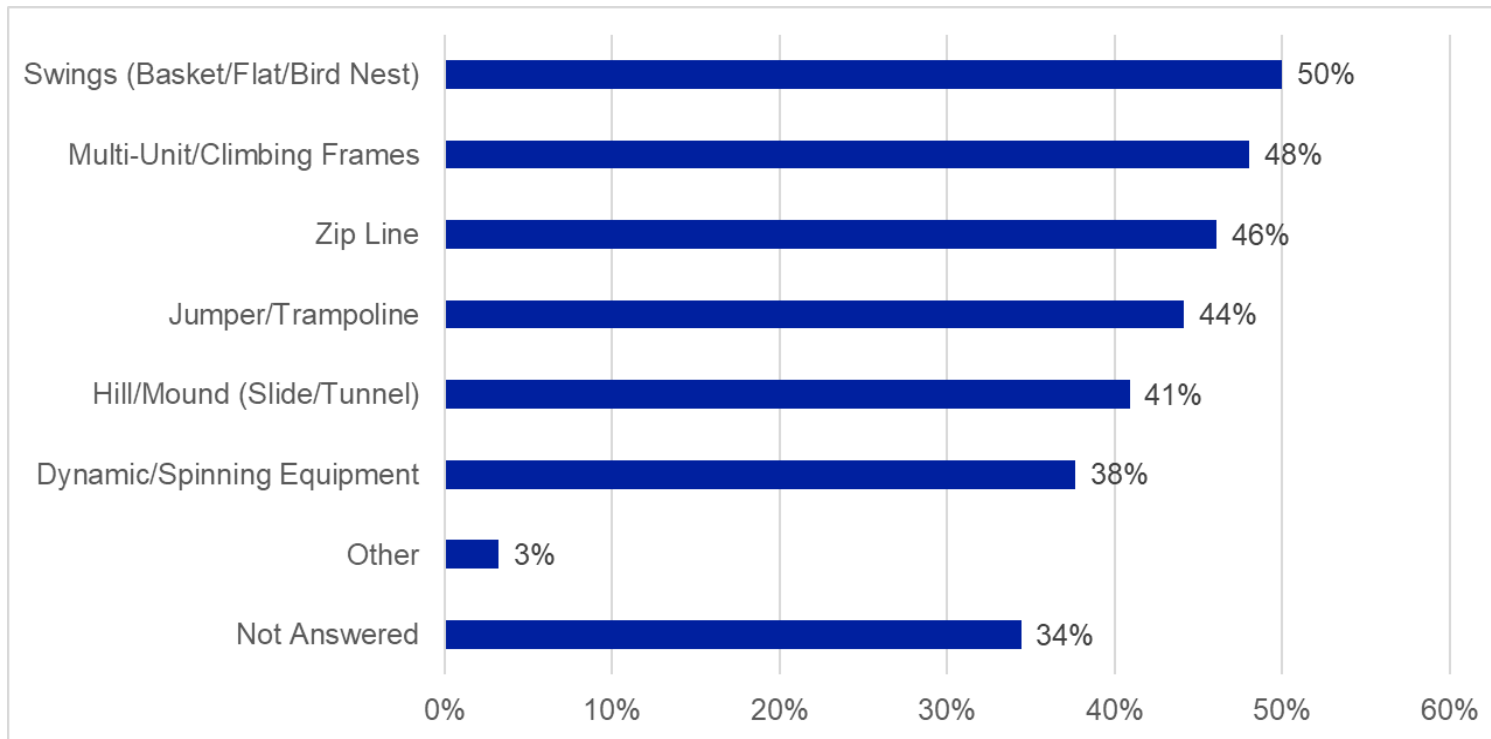

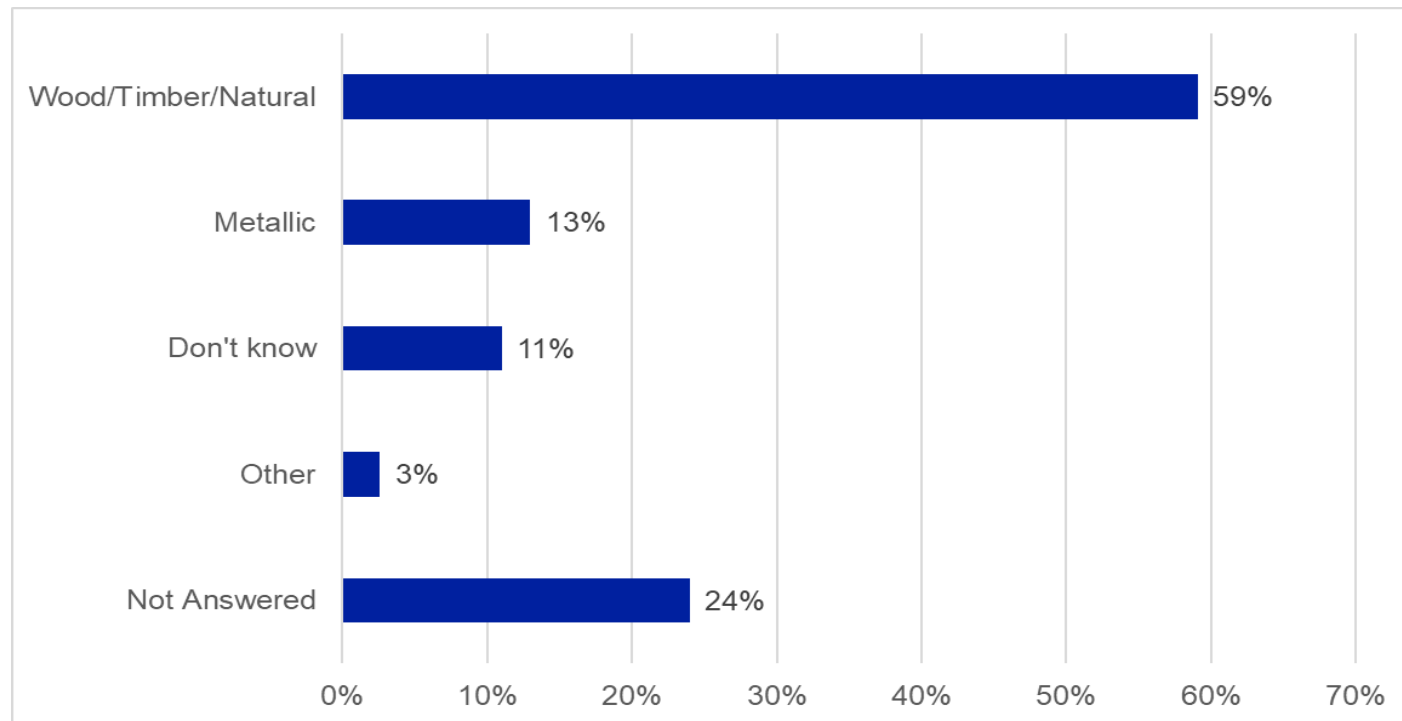

Other comments about the children's larger play area

"The key here is this area needs to be fenced off from DOGS. There are too many dogs in this area, too many owners that do not pick up dog droppings, and it is dangerous when some very large dogs are so near small children."

Fence required to keep separate from dogs

"The sand pit in the toddlers area is very unsatisfactory as the sand goes everywhere because of the poor design of the retaining wall and a significant amount of time is spent by the keepers using blowers to tidy up the area."

Improve the sandpit

"A lot of the children who use this playground in particular don't have gardens or outdoor areas - so it's extremely important to make this area serene, natural and fun. Grass, water features, flowers, are so important for mental health, as well as fun swings etc."

"Essential to fence to keep the place safe and clean from dogs."

"This park already has a huge area given over to play equipment - more than any other park I can think of nearby. The play area shouldn't expanded further or fences erected, as there is already limited area for sitting, walking, dog walking etc. If the garish equipment can be replaced with well crafted equipment made from natural materials in neutral colours, that would be a great improvement."

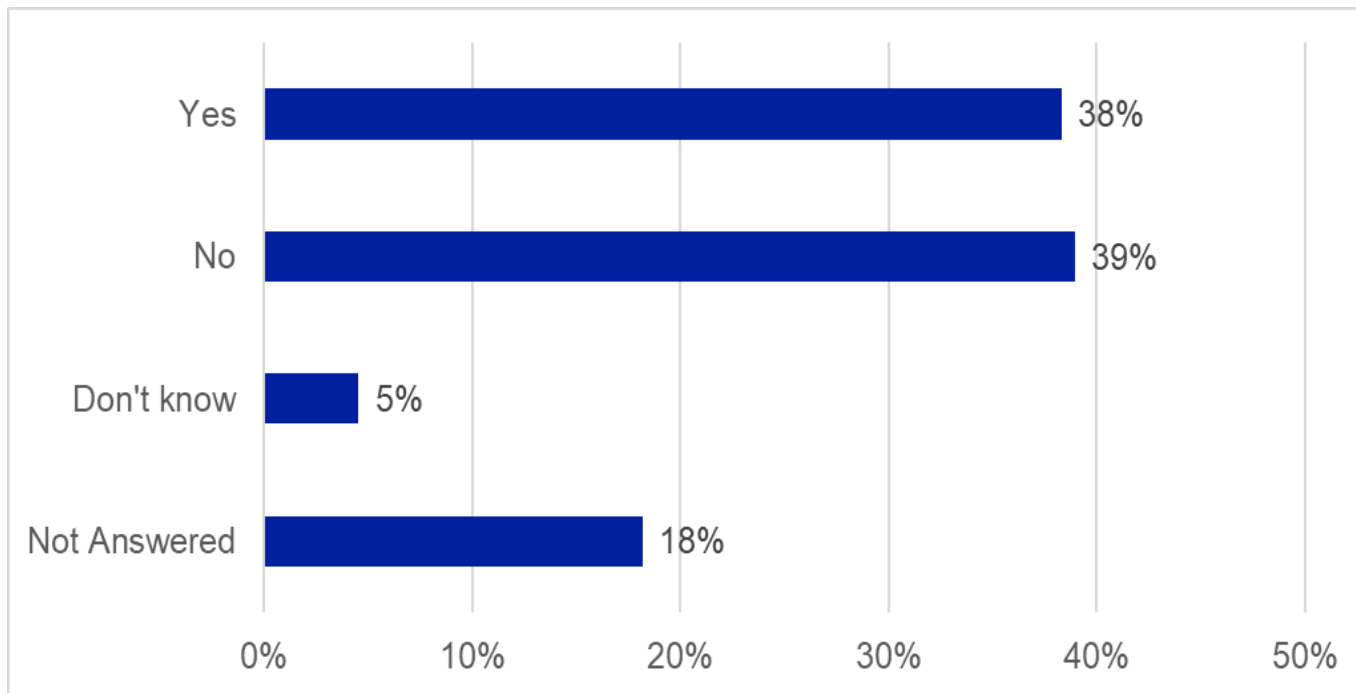

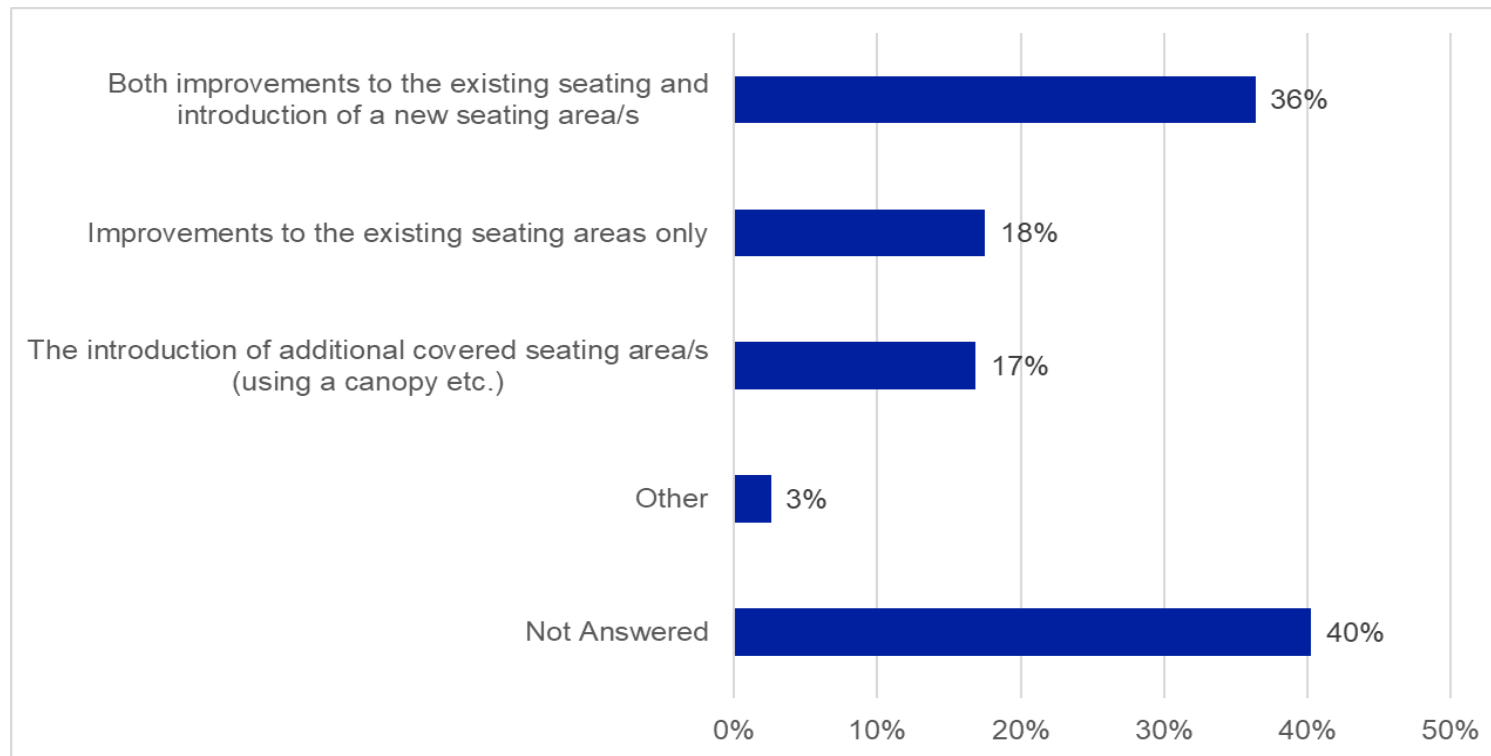

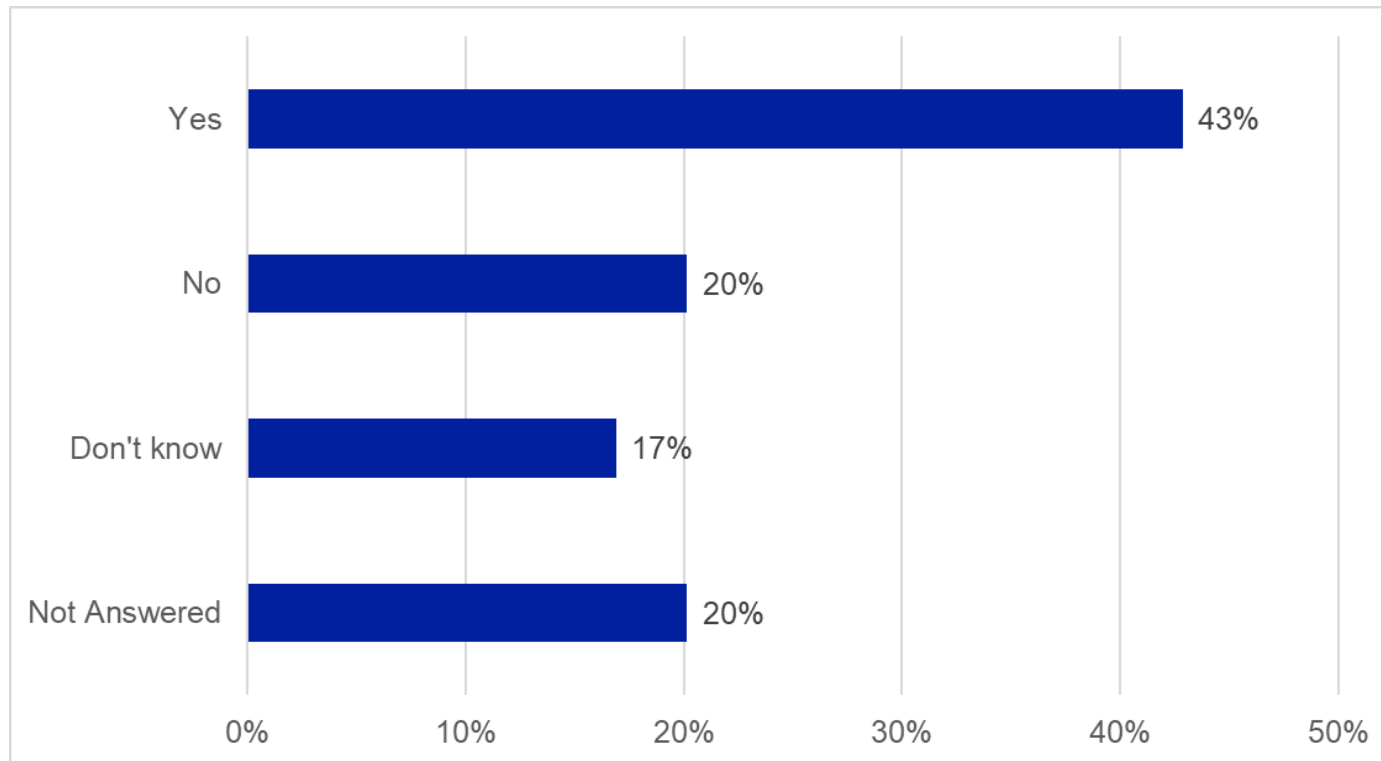

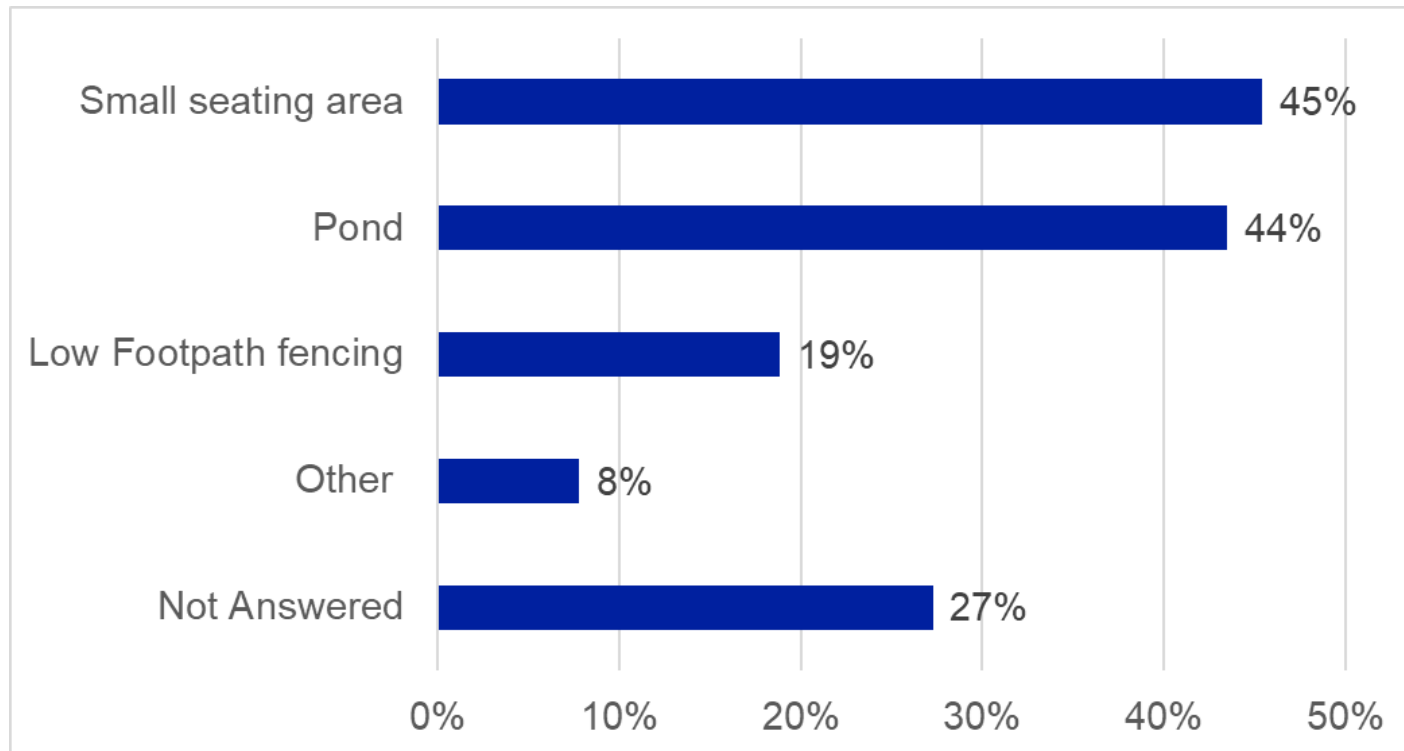

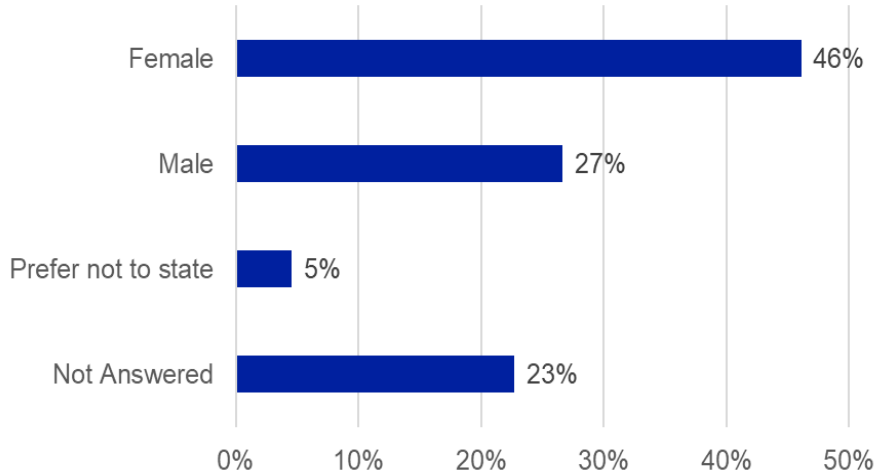

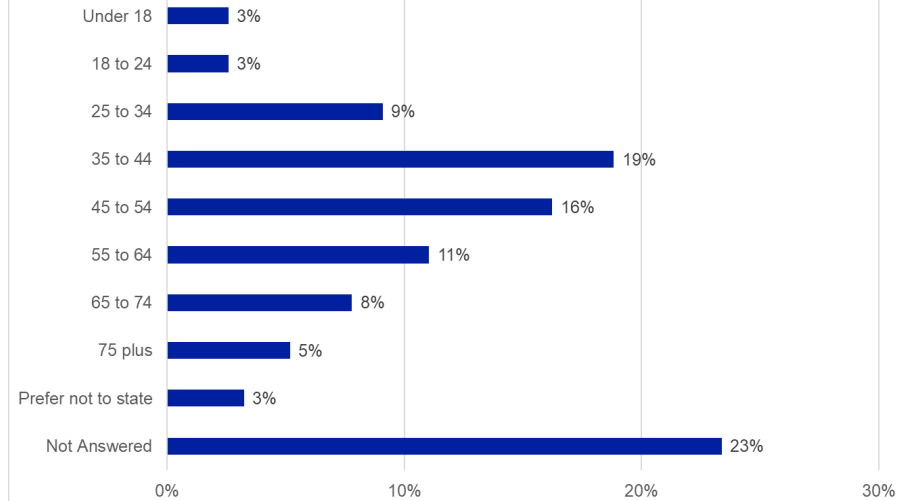

What is your sex?



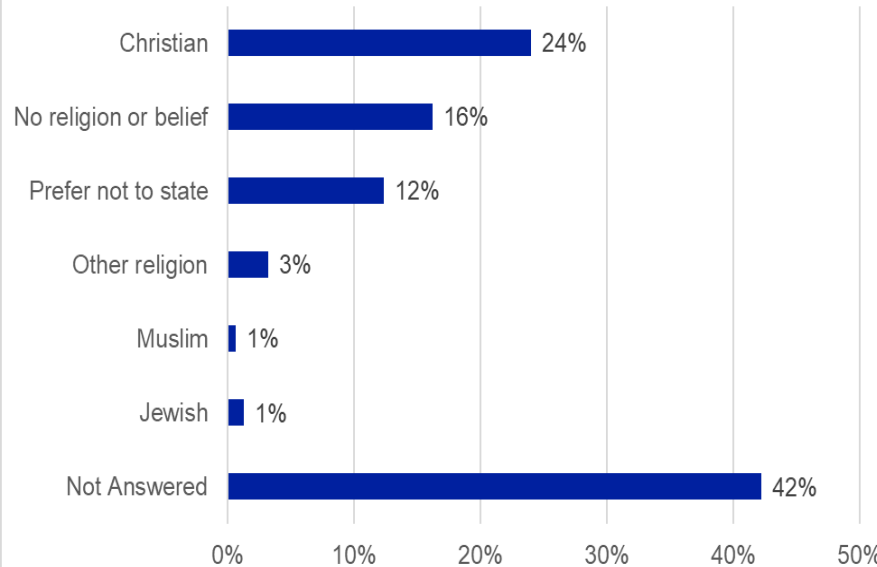

What is your age group?



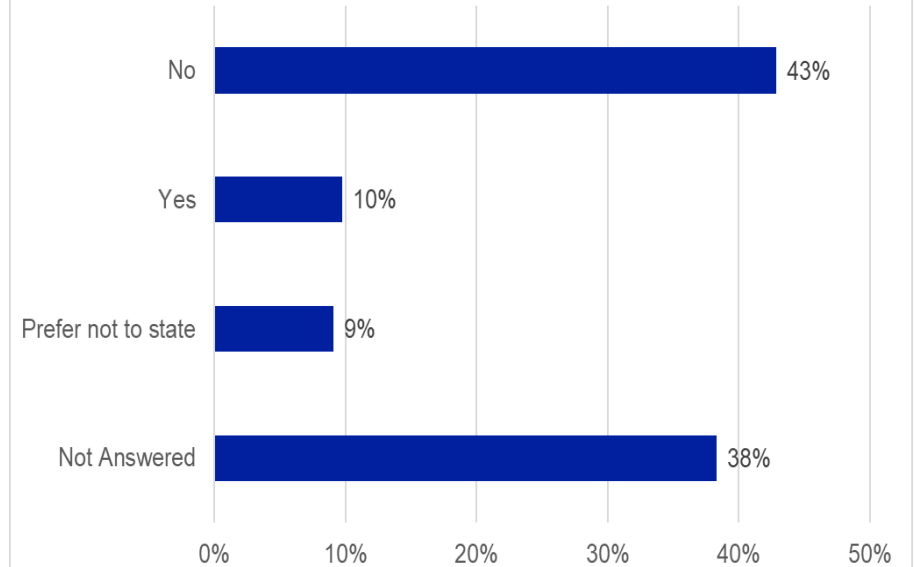

What is your religion/belief?



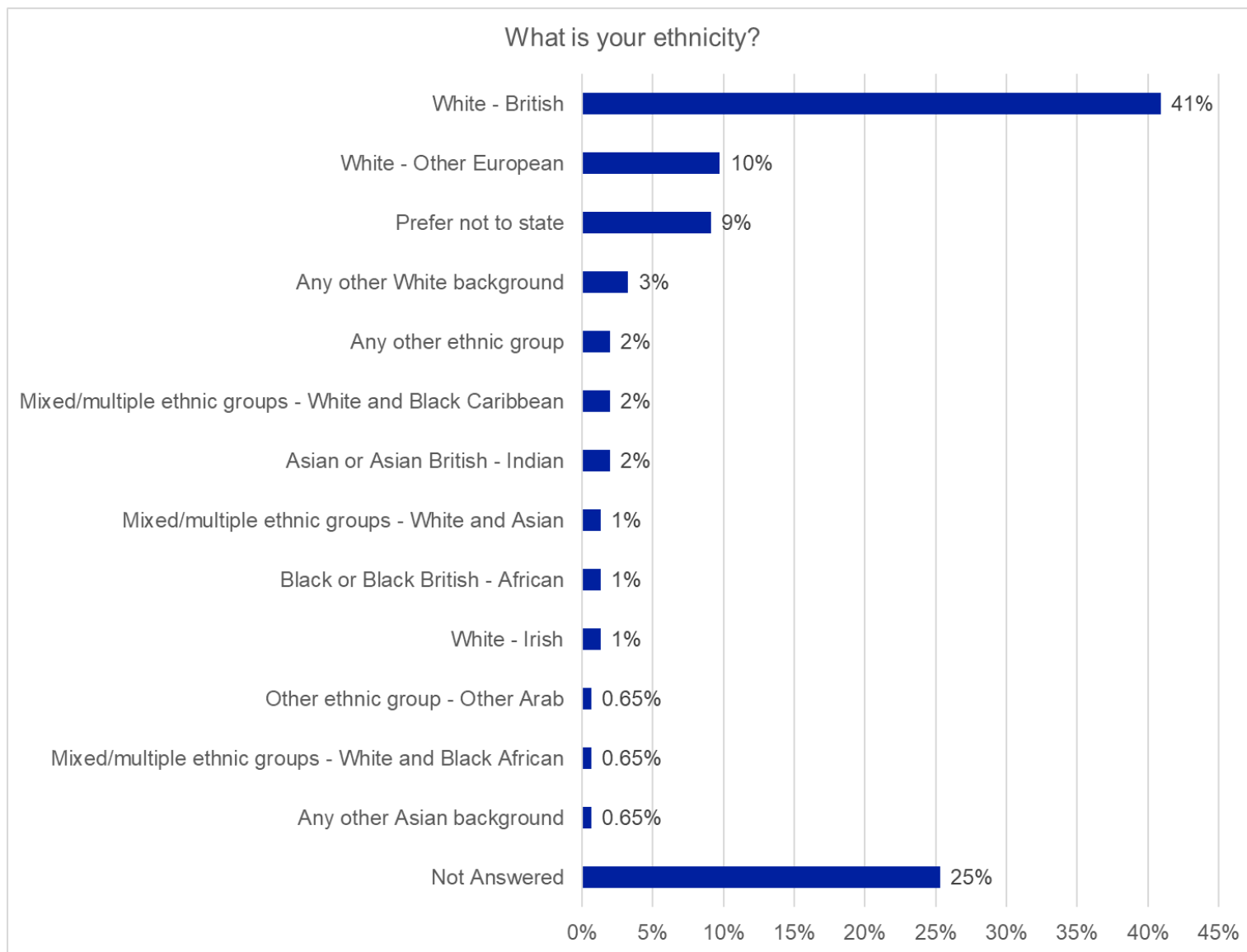
