PEDESTRIAN CROSSING CHANGES IN CHELSEA BRIDGE ROAD AND LOWER SLOANE STREET

Section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, with the approval of Westminster City Council proposes, under section 23 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to:
- (a) remove a 'zebra' pedestrian crossing in **Lower Sloane Street**, to the south of its junction with Sloane Gardens and establish a signal-controlled pedestrian crossing with its centreline 9.7 metres south of the southern kerbline of Sloane Gardens; and
- (b) establish a 'zebra' pedestrian crossing in **Chelsea Bridge Road** with its centreline located approximately 17 metres south of the southern kerb-line of the vehicle access to Chelsea Barracks.

Associated zig-zag markings would be placed on the carriageway either side of the crossings in accordance with the Zebra, Pelican and Puffin Pedestrian Crossing Regulations and Directions 1997 and these will indicate "at any time" restriction on waiting by vehicles, including waiting for the purposes of loading or unloading goods from a vehicle.
