**PORTOBELLO ROAD – PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONE
APPLYING ON FRIDAYS AND SATURDAYS BETWEEN 10AM AND 4PM**

The Kensington and Chelsea (Prescribed Routes) (No. 18) Traffic Order 2021

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea on 22nd November 2021 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effect of the Order will be to continue indefinitely the provisions of The Kensington and Chelsea (Prescribed Routes) (No. 8) Experimental Traffic Order 2020, that is, to prohibit all vehicles, other than pedal cycles:
 - (a) from proceeding south-eastwards in Portobello Road at its junction with Golborne Road; and
 - (b) from proceeding north-westwards in Portobello Road at its junction with Cambridge Gardens, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays

Note: The restrictions above will not apply to vehicles displaying a disabled persons' Blue Badge or vehicles used by the emergency services. The restrictions referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above will not apply to vehicles requiring access to properties in Portobello Road situated between Golborne Road and Oxford Gardens or any property that can only be accessed via that length of road. The restrictions referred to in sub-paragraph (b) above will not apply to vehicles requiring access to properties in Portobello Road situated between Cambridge Gardens and Oxford Gardens or any property that can only be accessed via that length of road.
3. A copy of the Order, which will come into force on 25th November 2021 and of all other relevant documents can be obtained via email for inspection by contacting trafficorders@rbkc.gov.uk quoting reference "Portobello Road (Golborne Road to Cambridge Gardens) Perm" and can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of six weeks from the date the Order was made at The Customer Service Centre, Kensington Town Hall, Hornton Street, London W8 7NX.
4. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
