PROPOSED CHANGES TO CERTAIN OFF-STREET RBKC HOUSING PARKING BAY PROVISIONS IN THE BALFOUR OF BURLEIGH, HENRY DICKENS COURT AND PORTOBELLO COURT HOUSING ESTATES

The Kensington and Chelsea (Housing Estates) (Off-Street Parking Places and Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Amendment No. 5) Order 2025

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) on 12th May 2025 will make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 35 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended
2. The general effect of the order which would be in respect of the following off-street housing estates:-
 - (a) **Balfour of Burleigh Housing Estate** – to introduce RBKC-Housing disabled parking bay (BOB 04) to the rear of Nos. 44 and 46 Hewer Street, situated in Bruce Close;
 - (b) **Henry Dickens Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing resident permit holders (HDC) bay (parking bay number 28) to RBKC-Housing disabled parking bay (HDC 20);
 - (c) **Portobello Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing visitors' parking (VIS) bay (parking bay number 3) to RBKC-Housing disabled parking bay (PBC 04); and
 - (d) **Portobello Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing resident permit holders (PBC) bay (parking bay number 5), to RBKC-Housing Visitors' parking (VIS) bay (parking bay number 5);
3. A copy of the Orders, which will come into operation on 19th May 2025 and of all other relevant documents can be obtained for inspection by emailing trafficorders@rbkc.gov.uk quoting reference: “Feb 25 Misc” and can be inspected at The Council Offices, The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, 37 Pembroke Road, London, W8 6PW between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of six weeks from the date the Order was made.
4. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Orders or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
