Ifield Road Playground improvements

Consultation report

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Background

Ifield Road Playground is a small outdoor play area located along Ifield Road, next to Earl's Court Youth Club.

It has toddler swings, a wooden see-saw and a metal climbing frame on blue safety matting. It also has trees, flowers and shrubs. The play equipment and its blue safety surfacing are coming to the end of their life and need to be replaced.

Consultation Methodology

An online survey was promoted to residents via a variety of means (like posters in the playground and within Earl's Court Youth Club), including the Council's website and enewsletter and Council officers also visited the park and distributed paper versions of the survey for residents to complete.

Report

A total of 22 surveys were returned by the deadline. This report contains data tables and comments detailing the responses to the survey questions. Percentage figures are not included in in this document as these figures can be misleading due to the low number of responses.

Results of the consultation

The below is a brief summary of findings from the consultation.

1: How often do you visit Ifield Road Playground?

Eight respondents said they visit the playground once a week and seven two to three times a week.

If you are dissatisfied with any of the above, please tell us why and what changes you would like to see.

There were 14 responses to this part of the question:

- Older children's swings needed. Tarmac too hard when falling.
- Swings for older kids. No tarmac-when falling it hurts.
- Rattling cage when ball hits it or kicked. Netting at pitch damaged. Noise in general, no older teenagers on pitch (pitch timings late and closed at weekends).
- Not much for older kids. Climbing frame dangerous.
- Like it as it is.
- More activities for example: -slides and older swings (flat seat). Floor quite dangerous (more soft play). Sand pit and seating. More colourful shapes on ground (painted).
- Move equipment.
- A little bit more equipment.
- Small fence next to youth club (black railing fence): -small children can
 walk through as vertical bars are too wide. Planted areas attract dogs.
 More dog bins in the area. Self closing gate please for safety.
- Would it to be a bit more natural. Playing in "nature"
- Got bored of swings. Need older swings and slide please. Gates-need to be self-closing (safety). Play frame can be dangerous,
- Update it. Children between 5 and 12 years old not enough to do.
- Modernise, More safer surfacing, Sand pit, Slide.
- More safer surfacing-not tarmac.

3: We are looking to replace the current play equipment. What age groups do you think new play equipment should be aimed at? (Please note, respondents could select more than one answer option for this question)

Twenty respondents would like to see play equipment aimed at 0 to 4 year olds and twenty-one would like to see equipment aimed at 5 to 8 year olds.

4: What type of equipment would you like to see in the new playground? Please rank your top four choices in order of preference (One being your first choice, through to 4 being your 4th choice)

Respondents were asked to choose the top four pieces of equipment they would like to see installed. Each option was assigned a score, and a mean score was calculated to establish the priority order, which can be found in the chart below.

Respondents were asked to specify what other type of equipment they would like to see.

There were 19 responses to this part of the question:

- Trampoline. And no. 4 keep the existing climbing frame with boulder wall.
- Trampoline please.
- Trampoline.
- St. Luke's playground spinning item you can sit on.
- Basket swing.
- Basket swing.
- Basketball Hoop.
- Any of the above.
- Seating for adults. More soft flooring. Basket swing. Roundabout like in St. Luke's Park.
- More safer surface please.
- More soft flooring.
- Roundabout.
- See-Saw (for younger and older).
- Possibly with a lid to stop animals soiling? Updating what basically is already here.
- Trampoline. Not for children over 12 years please (under 12 years only)
- Trampoline.
- Gym equipment.

- Woodchip/both surfacing.
- Monkey bars.

In the above comments, 'Trampoline' was mentioned five times.

5: What colour theme would you prefer for the play items and safer surfacing?

Thirteen respondents would prefer bright colours, such as red, blue and yellow.

- Make planting area (wooden edge) smaller to get more play equipment in hopscotch/bench. Don't like tarmac-hard when falling.
- 1. Ball Games. 2. Hopscotch. 3. Make fences higher to stop balls and intruders. 4. Bench. 5. Remove tarmac, it hurts when falling.
- A very popular little playground. Most used item are the toddler swings.
 Junior swings should be avoided as they will attract older children who
 may be too boisterous for such a small site. Keep/update the centre island
 as this provides seating for adults and allows small children to play chase
 around it.
- No mural on wall. Well maintained after planting. No cricket stump painted on wall. The board for Earl's Court Youth Club no longer lives on Ifield Road. (should be more representatives of local area).
- No wildlife please.
- More access to the fenced kickabout area in holiday periods.
- More colour in the planting.
- Something that is green or flowers all year round.
- Whole playground should have soft surface and a bench.
- Seating for parents. Safety very important.
- Not bees (they sting).
- Shade from sunshine.
- Exercise equipment.
