HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 – SECTION 90A

**LATIMER ROAD
TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES (NCIL SH1)**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) proposes, under Section 90A of the Highways Act 1980, to construct the type of road humps known as “sinusoidal road humps” at the following locations in Latimer Road (measurements are given from the centre line of the road hump):

- (i) 8 metres north of the back of the footway on the northern side of Oxford Gardens at its junction with Latimer Road;
- (ii) 2 metres south of the common boundary of Nos. 210 and 220 Latimer Road;
- (iii) 3 metres north of the common boundary of Nos. 238 and 240 Latimer Road;
- (iv) at the common boundary of Nos. 268 and 270 Latimer Road;
- (v) 3 metres north of the common boundary of Nos. 278 and 280 Latimer Road;
- (vi) 4 metres south of the back of the footway on the southern side of Snarsgate Street at its junction with Latimer Road; and
- (vii) 2 metres south of the common boundary of Nos. 328 and 330 Latimer Road.

[Note: Each “sinusoidal road hump” would be an elevated section of carriageway with a round top, 75mm millimetres higher at its highest point than the surrounding carriageway, varying between approximately 8 metres and 9 metres wide and approximately 3.7 metres in length].

2. The road humps are being introduced as part of a scheme intended to reduce traffic speeds on Latimer Road.
