PROPOSED CHANGES TO CERTAIN OFF-STREET RBKC HOUSING PARKING BAY PROVISIONS IN THE
LONGLANDS COURT HOUSING ESTATE

*The Kensington and Chelsea (Housing Estates) (Off-Street Parking Places and Waiting and Loading Restrictions)
(Amendment No. 4) Order 2024*

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea on 17th December 2024 have made the above-mentioned Order under sections 35 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
2. The general effect of the order which would be in respect of the following off-street housing estates:-
 - (a) **Longlands Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing disabled parking bay (LLC 04), to a RBKC-Housing motorcycle parking bay;
 - (b) **Longlands Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing Resident Permit Holders (LLC) bay (parking bay number 17), to RBKC-Housing Disabled Parking bay (LLC 06);
 - (c) **Longlands Court Housing Estate** - to convert RBKC-Housing Disabled Parking bay (LLC 02), to RBKC-Housing Resident Permit Holders (LLC) bay (parking bay number 12); and
 - (d) **Longlands Court Housing Estate** - to convert a RBKC-Housing motorcycle parking bay between RBKC-Housing residents' parking bays Nos. 9 and 10, to hatched markings;
3. A copy of the Order, which will come into force on 24th December 2024 and of all other relevant documents can be obtained for inspection by emailing trafficorders@rbkc.gov.uk, quoting reference: "Housing Amend 4" and can be inspected at The Council Offices, The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea, 37 Pembroke Road, London, W8 6PW between 9am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of six weeks from the date the Order was made.
4. Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
5. Under the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, any letter you write to the Council in response to this Notice may be made available to the press and to the public, who would be entitled to take copies of it if they so wished.
